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## 1) Materials needed for class:

a) Pencil or Pen- students are expected to bring a writing utensil to every class. All assignments being collected must be completed in pencil, or blue/black ink pen.
b) $\mathbf{3}$ ring binder with dividers (5)- Students are required to bring a binder with them to class every day. Binders will house daily notes, extra practice worksheets, as well as a copy of the class expectations. Sections will be labeled in class during the first week of school.
c) Calculator- Students will be assigned a calculator for in class use only. These calculators are not to leave the classroom. Students may use their own calculators for assignments at home where applicable. Students may not use their phones as calculators in class.

## 2) Daily Routine:

a) "Do Now" - to be completed upon arrival to class. Will be collected on a weekly basis
b) Overview of objectives and instructions
c) Learning Activities/Notes
d) Independent/Group Practice

3) Absences: Students should...
a) Stay after and get the work or ask classmates for assignments.
b) Check the missing work folders posted in the classroom.

## 4) Participation:

- Students are expected to participate in class discussions, as well as in various group activities. Students are encouraged to ask questions and contribute to discussions on a daily basis.


## 5) Grades:

- Grades are based on a point system. Marking Period grades are determined by dividing the total number of points achieved by the total points possible.
- Homework/Classwork 5-25 points per assignment
- Quizzes
- Tests

10-75 points per quiz
75-200 points per test

- A marking period deadline is set for each unit of study: once the unit of study has been completed, students will not be able to retake or make-up tests/quizzes after the deadline.
- Homework: 5 points
- No late assignments will be allowed. It is due when stated.
- Assigned 3-4 days per week.
- May be graded for completion using the rubric listed below.

1. Outstanding 5 Points - The student completed all parts of the assignments and demonstrated exemplary proficiency of the task/skills.
2. Satisfactory 3 Points - The student completed all/most of the assignment and demonstrated sufficient proficiency of the task/skills with minimal errors.
3. Unsatisfactory 1 Points - The student did not complete the assignment and did not demonstrate sufficient proficiency of the task/skills.
4. Incomplete/Missing 0 Points - The student is absent or missing and does not has the assignment with them.

- Tests/ Quizzes:
- 10-200 points per quiz/test.
- Students may request to retest a topic if they scored below a $70 \%$ on the assessment. They must fill out a "Request to Retest" form and submit it to make an appointment to retest.
- Quizzes are usually given weekly, and tests are given at the end of each unit.
- Students may take 2-4 unit tests a marking period.
